Set #1

- Directions: Match the words with the correct definitions to create a tree.
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- Words that have the same ending sounds.
- The regular beat in a poem.

Set #2

- The place where one line stops and a new line starts.
- Lines of poetry grouped together in a pattern.
- Figures of speech in which sensory details are used to create vivid pictures.
- A figure of speech in which two unlike things are compared using "like" or "as".
- A figure of speech in which two unlike things are compared using "is" or "are".

Set #3

- A figure of speech in which a word is used that has a different meaning than the object or action it represents.
- A figure of speech in which human qualities are used to describe non-human objects.
- A word or phrase that is used to describe two or more things that have the same characteristics.
- A figure of speech in which words are used that sound alike but have different meanings in an attempt to be funny.
- A figure of speech in which a word or phrase is used to read something that is not there.
- A figure of speech in which exaggeration is used to create emphasis or "effect".
