

**Types of Hair**

Cats are **mammals**, which means they are covered with fur or hair. There are several different types of hair found on a cat's body. **Back hair** are the five hairs that make up the cat's back coat. **Guard hairs** are the longer, thicker, coarse hairs that usually determine the color of the cat. These hairs can also provide a waterproof layer to some breeds. **Down hairs** are called the undercoat, and the softest. **Ruffian** hairs underneath the guard hairs that help insulate the body.
